# **BIBLE SONGS OF CHRISTMAS**


#### SERIES EXPLANATION







## **Opening Sentences**



- <sup>51</sup> He has shown strength with his arm.


He has scattered those who were proud in the thoughts of their hearts.


<sup>52</sup> He has brought down rulers from their thrones.
