# UNDIVIDED ATTENTION

#### SERIES EXPLANATION

We live in a world where a thousand things are competing for our attention. There is the real danger that we focus on the frivolous and ignore the indispensable. As a result, we often talk about the importance of being "free from distraction." But the stakes are higher than that. We need to be *freed* from distraction. We need the spiritual power to give our undivided attention to that which truly makes a difference, not only here and now, but also in eternity. A life focused on all the right things is only possible because of a Savior who is always focused on us. On the Day of Pentecost, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to give his followers power and focus. Still today, through his Word, Jesus grants those gifts to his disciples.

We have come to the second half of the Church Year. In the first half, we focused on the life of Christ. In this second half, we turn our attention to all the teachings of Christ. May we give them our undivided attention.

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#### **INVOCATION**


- M: The grace of our Lord (+) Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

First Reading Genesis 15:1–6


<sup>1</sup>After these events the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision. He said, "Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield, your very great reward."

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# **Second Reading**

Hebrews 11:1-3,8-16

<sup>1</sup>Faith is being sure about what we hope for, being convinced about things we do not see. <sup>2</sup>For by this faith the ancients were commended in Scripture. <sup>3</sup>By faith we know that the universe was created by God's word, so that what is seen did not come from visible things.

<sup>8</sup>By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go to a place that he was going to receive as an inheritance, and he left without knowing where he was going. <sup>9</sup>By faith he lived as a stranger in the Promised Land, as if it did not belong to him, dwelling in tents along with Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. <sup>10</sup>For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God.

"By faith Abraham also received the ability to conceive children, even though Sarah herself was barren and he was past the normal age, because he considered him faithful who made the promise. <sup>12</sup>And so from one man, and he as good as dead, descendants were born as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand along the seashore.

<sup>13</sup>One by one, all of these died in faith, without having received the things that were promised, but they saw and welcomed them from a distance. They confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth. <sup>14</sup>Indeed, people who say things like that make it clear that they are looking for a land of their own. <sup>15</sup>And if they were remembering the land they had come from, they would have had an opportunity to return. <sup>16</sup>Instead, they were longing for a better land—a heavenly one. For that reason, God is not ashamed to be called their God, because he prepared a city for them.

Luke 12:32

Alleluia. Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. Alleluia.



Gospel Luke 12:13–34

<sup>13</sup>Someone from the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me." <sup>14</sup>But Jesus said to him, "Man, who appointed me to be a judge or an arbitrator over you?"

<sup>15</sup>Then he said to them, "Watch out and be on guard against all greed, because a man's life is not measured by how many possessions he has."

<sup>16</sup>He told them a parable: "The land of a certain rich man produced very well. <sup>17</sup>He was thinking to himself, 'What will I do, because I do not have anywhere to store my crops?' <sup>18</sup>He said, 'This is what I will do. I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store all my grain and goods. <sup>19</sup>And I will tell my soul, "Soul, you have many goods stored up for many years. Take it easy. Eat, drink, and be merry."

<sup>20</sup>"But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your soul will be demanded from you. Now who will get what you have prepared?'

<sup>21</sup>"That is how it will be for anyone who stores up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God."

<sup>22</sup>Jesus said to his disciples, "For that reason I tell you, stop worrying about your life, about what you will eat, or about your body, what you will wear. <sup>23</sup>Certainly life is more than food, and the body is more than clothing. <sup>24</sup>Consider the ravens: They do not sow or reap; they have no warehouse or barn; and yet God feeds them. How much more valuable are you than birds! <sup>25</sup>And who of you by worrying can add a single moment to his lifespan? <sup>26</sup>Since you are not able to do this little thing, why do you worry about the rest? <sup>27</sup>Consider how the wild flowers grow. They do not labor or spin. But I tell you, not even Solomon in all his glory was dressed like one of these. <sup>28</sup>If this is how God clothes the grass in the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the furnace, how much more will he clothe you, you of little faith? <sup>29</sup>Do not constantly chase after what you will eat or what you will drink. Do not be worried about it. 30To be sure, the nations of the world chase after all of these things, but your Father knows that you need them. 31Instead, continue to seek the kingdom of God, and all these things will be added to you. <sup>32</sup>Do not be afraid, little flock, because your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. <sup>33</sup>Sell your possessions and give to the needy. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not become old, a treasure in the heavens that will not fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. <sup>34</sup>For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

The Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you.


